
The Hurth- Measure / Ruler



The Hurth-Measuring Tool is made of high quality plastic. A 41cm (16..inches) arm and a 30cm (12 inches) arm are at one end connected by an eyelet.

The connection is movable .A third 18cm (7 inch) long arm can be slip over one of the longer arms. The scaling of the long arm starts at the very end, the scaling of the shorter arms begins at the side of the longer arm (width of one arm).



There is a helpline at the begin of the scaling to control the right angle.



The scaling is in cm and inches.

Through an eye in the longer arm one can see the scaling for angles from 0-25 degrees on the shorter arm.





The flexibility of the plastic let the armsof the ruler bend on the body of the person to measure.

Left: armhole depth back Right: backlength to armpit





Left: armhole depth (distance)


This measurement is very difficult to measure without a special tool like this.

Right: Shoulder Depth






Other Utilities
